Artists are gathering in the CBD and harbour foreshore. Lantern boats are now floating at Circular Quay, a drumming pod is on the arch of the Harbour Bridge and sand mandalas have been set up in Hyde Park.

Time to Join in! Don't forget to use spaces in the decolonised heritage institutions: Sydney Opera House, Art Gallery of New South Wales, Australian Museum and State Theatre.

Children's arts and childcare activities will be located near most language clusters. Bring the kids, roster yourself on and don't forget to dress up.
